Education Committee

- The national "Watchdog" program for schools will be researched and considered for LCS over the next month and discussed at our next meeting.
- Teacher evaluations will begin this year by Vince Bonnema and Jill Ellens with a goal of doing half the staff this school year and the other half next school year. Teacher evaluations will then be done at least once every three years according to policy.
- Reading intervention subcommittee will meet over the next two months to be aware of and evaluate alternative reading intervention programs. This is not evaluating LCS's present program; its success is already clear. This is being proactive in the event change is necessitated. A report to education committee will occur in December.
